There's no jobs at that time, no kind. Nobody had jobs at that time other than raising cattles or raising hell, that's all---see. There's no job but that. It was nothing like you see now.

(Did your Grandfather raise crops?)

Oh yeah, he raised a few cattles, horses, and chickens, and some garden stuff---potatoes, corn, and cotton. Just enough to get by on. We're not the agriculture type like the eastern Indians over there, like the Mohawks, and the Cherokee and all that there.

ORIGIN OF THE KIOWA-APACHE

(You mean the Apaches aren't?)

No. Like I say we migrate summer time we go back north to the Dakota's toward fall we drift back down here. In the winter time we live here in Texas. Where it's warm. And summertime way up in the Dakota's where it's cool. We don't stay in one place. But during one of these wars, resolution or revolution, or civil war, we caught down here where we're at. We're originally from the Dakota's from Devil's Lake. That story I will tell later. I'll bring that out. My stories are coming back from I sent them with my nephew. He's going to bring them back this week-end. When he does I'm going over it and review it then put that down. A little better than what I've written.
