Green, Hoby Green lived on the place, and that was his children. I believe it was one of his nephews, and, maybe a couple of his children (not clear). And it could have been his (not clear), I don't know. And I'm very old. EARLY DAY SCHOOLS HAVE DISAPPEARED

(Yeah, there was evidence that there was about 25 buried there. That little school up there, it's a -- I am real interested in that. Is that an old place?)

Well, yeah, well that's (not clear) school there. I just don't remember what year, long before statehood.

(Before statehood.)

Yeah, and they had a school there.

(It look like it been closed for long time now?)

Yeah.

(Some one's using it for a hay barn now?)

Yeah, it would have been disposed of because (not clear) .

(Yeah, so many of those old school have already disappeared.)

Yeah, that's right.

(It'd be nice if some one had gotten a picture, of all of them before they -- It's too tate for many of them now.)

That's right. Too late to get much information.

(That's right. Well, that was a -- I looked at that school house, and I thought, well, it's just a tiny thing, but a lot of kids went there, I guess, from around that country. What was the name of that community up in there? Would that be the Sunnyside School?)

Sunnyside School is what they called it.
