the corner? There's an old house looking place there.)

Mile east of -- . (Dawes Cemetery. Maybe, it's two miles east.)

Well, it's a mile south and a mile east.

(Maybe, that's right. It's a mile south and a mile east.) ... It's where the old house is.

(Yeah.)

Well, my home place is a mile south of that. That's where I -- .  $\checkmark$  (That's down there in that good farming land there.)

Well.

(Looks it's awful good.) '-

Well, that was known, the Centerview school. The old school house is on a quarter mile east to that and that house there. So, that'd make it -oh, about three mile south of (not clear), and a mile and a half east. That was the Pack Cemetery, and Dawes Cemetery is on back on the hill. (Sixty years ago, what was that country like down in there before they had section lines, all fences up?)

Well, it used to belonged to anybody who wanted it first, and every man if he had it under the fence, why, he, maybe had some Cherokee claim for him. Why, it was his, you know, until the allotment come along and --(Was that farming country or cattle country?)

It was farming country then, mostly.

(I guess, wheat, corn, and oats, and -- .)

Well, yeah.

(There was no cotton up in that country, was there?)

(There\*was?)
