They run the Osages off of over there, in that old poor country up there, and they found the oil over there.

(They became millionaires.) (Laughter.)

Yeah.

VANN FAMILY WERE PROMINENT PEOPLE

(In that same of Osage community area, the Vanns must have been quite prominent family in the early—days. What have your heard about Vann's Chapel? Was there actually a church or --)

That was that old cemetery right there by where the where they (words not clear) out there.

(Well.)

Oh, yes, I been there when I was a kid.

(Well, which way from Harrison's house was it located?)

It was right-seems like it was just right out west of the cemetery. Right west, kinda up in the edge of the woods. Ain't been tore down too many years. It was well built old thing--made out of big old heavy stuff, solike-so, eight by ten.

(Was that Webb Vann's place?)

Webb Vann's place is the old half block and stone house. It's right there by the school house. That's where --

(Yeah, that must have been his family cemetery upon the hill there then.)

No, I think he--I think he's buried over here. Of course, they moved into Pryor here. That's where the Vann's street (not clear). But the-he-- that was he built that church.

(Well.)

He built Vann chapel. He built Vann's Chapel out of his own money. I can remember the story so well about from him, Sam Mayes run for the chief
