Used the bottom part for the church house and then the other part for a lodge.

Mrs. Garvin: Now the Odd Fellows and the Woodman's and the Woodman's Circle, all, they all met there different times.

Mrs. Garvin: Let me see now. It would be later than that.

Mrs. Garvin: I don't remember when that buildingwas layed, but Mr. Cameron built it. I remember them talking about. I think that's who built it.

That's about when it was.

Mrs. Garvin: No now. let's see. Maybe I'm wrong on that. He built several of these old colonial homes around here. Now he built that Garvin home. It was a two story home. He built the Uncle Dave Faulkner home. That's another Indian home. It was a two story colonial home and he made them.

(Interruption)

Mrs. Garvin: Well, its just back of these buildings down here. Now this is where those buildings are down here at Hanson lined up. Well, the stores were lined up there. And his home was just back there where that—where that old—where that building is, back that and there's a cemetery there too. And it was the two story building—

(Yes ma'am.)

Mrs. Garvin: Like the Garvin home was and it burned too.
He was a good family man too.

(Yeah.)

And he was the chief of the Indians.
