BACKGROUND OF INFORMANT:

Margaret Sixkiller Bagby was 50 years old at the time of this interview. She was born in northeastern Adair County, and lives near her original birthplace. Mrs. Bagby has retained many articles, pictures, manuscripts, etc. of the history of that part of northeastern Oklahoma which was the Goingsnake District of the Cherokee Nation. She relates many stories that were told to her by her mother and father. Her grandfather, Soldier Sixkiller, played an important part in the development and progress of this area.
