Well, in the evening when they quit they got quitting song. Quitting song. On and on well when they quit, why they all go out for supper. They go home and cook supper when it's over. And Sunday night, they come back again, and go over again, all night. Then in night, when it's over, they some some songs, quitting songs, too. When it's over they all get up and go home and they do that every Saturday night and Sunday and Sunday night. That's where that dancing take place.

(When do they quit on Sunday night?)

Oh, about twelve, yea about twelve, they quit.

(Did they ever dance outside the tipi?)

No, not with the Apaches, but the Kiowas at Carnegie. They used to dance outside. You know, they went way around, lot of people there. But now as Apaches, we don't dance outside, just inside. And sometime, women they get to feeling good inside, just like that Holy Roly you might say, they get that way, some kind of shaking or spell. Well, that's what it is. Sometime they fall and roll around and roll around. Yea, just like holiness.

(What kinds of clothes did the women wear at the Ghost Dance?)

Well, on Sunday they got some buckskinsuit, sometimes with a moon design on the front and some rainbow colors here on the front, and they wear feathers, with some kind of..got big cross on the middle of that feather. They wear in on back of head. They got little short hair up here on top in back of their head. Braid, little braid, and they put their feather in here. And that's what goes with that Ghost Dance.

Did you say they wear that on Sunday. What did they wear on Saturday night?
