Well, they wear feathers, too. They don't got buckskins, but they got white sheets around their waist. So they go in there and they put their good shirt on and moccasin shoes on. Yea, that's the way I know of..around the Apaches. And, they always call it Apache Camp over there, now it's Hatchetville, name now.

(How many Apaches would come to one of these Ghost Dances?)

Well, seems like all the older people. I could say about eight nine men in front to sing for the church. Womens all back there. I don't know how many could be. I could say about ten twelve of them. Oh the childrens could go in there too. I used to go in there. They call it..you belong to Ghost Dance, like you belong to Manatidie, or something. Well, it's way it is. You got to belong to it. But if you don't belong to it, you could go in just the same. But those that belong to it, they going have that buckskin that feather.

(What kind of songs did they sing?)

Oh, they too many.

(Were they special songs for Ghost Dance?)

Yea, special but oh, it's too long. I forgot all the songs.

(Did they sing with the drum?)
