

(Did they ever dance on the outside of that house?)

Yea. Way, stand all around, just like Kiowa Ghost Dance, all in circle.

And they all dancing. Men, they singing and they go around, they go around, they go around. But I don't know how many songs they sing.

(When the Kiowas had their Ghost Dance, did they have a tipi set up too?)

Yes. Yea, they got big tipi. Most people goes in there. Apaches, they got pretty good size tipi.

(During the night on Saturday night and Sunday, in the tipi, did one person ever make a prayer or make a long talk like they do in peyote meetings now?)

Yea. They get up, stand up cause they all know that somebody's going pray and they all listen. Course, they all bow down and they listen.

This woman or man be praying, like that. And they sit down, go to singing again, same thing all day.

(So they'd sing four songs, then is that right?)

Yea.

(Then if somebody wanted to pray they could?)

Yea. See there's four songs, four songs, four songs, four songs, four time four songs, they sing. That's what they do.

(Then what happens after the four times four songs?)

Well, when they quit, same way..smoke again. I think they smoke four times..four times, you know. Like you could smoke..and when they quit,

why they could say them prayers again. And when it's over they going smoke again. Same way again. Four times, they smoke until it's over.

That's when they quit.

(When could you dance inside the tipi?)

Anytime..you feel like dancing when they singing some songs. Sometimes
