Yeah. Yeah, they'll start having 'em there now. They was having 'em over at the Council house during the winter. They have it the first Tuesday in every month. There's lot of different tribes. Some of 'em talk Indian. You can see and hear where the different tribes can understand one another. But my tribe I've never run across different tribe of Indian that talks anything like my tribe.
