(Yeah, seem like the eagle feathers and hawk feathers were the most important used. But now they can't get eagle feathers they tell me.)

Yeah, it's against the law to kill an eagle.

('Course now on deer tails. They still use lots of deer tails.)

They're getting so they can make those head roaches out of plastic.

(Is that right?)

Yeah. They're pretty too.
