CEMETERIES IN THE AREA

(In the southeast end. Now were those moved from Alluwe, or somewhere.)

(Sentence not clear.)

(I'll go see that one then on my way back home this afternoon.)

(See that was a Mrs. John--?)

Mrs. John Sallee.

(Saley, would it--?)

I don't know just how you spell it--

(Yeah.)

Reason I --years ago and years afterwards. Mr. Sallee came down there and he kept that grave so pretty. And of course; his being (word not clear) you know.

(Yes ma'm.)

And if he--Monday. He'd go down there and there must have been oh two or three hundred of satin ribbon bows that he had covered with--

(Well, that would be a beautiful thing. Which part of the cemetery would that be? Near whose--?)

(Answer not clear.)
