(Did you ever hear how long that school existed? When it started? When it closed?)

Cole or Midway?

(Cole or Midway, whichever it goes by.)

Well, let's see. That went out January --lasted forty-five years. But that doesn't add up. I really wouldn't know. Because that was the first school I went to.

(It was just a little plain building, was it or brick building?)
It was just a little plain building.

RECALLS SOME BURIAL CUSTOMS

(Uh-huh. You know that is what you were telling me while ago about the burying that horse there in a grave beside that Indian. That apparently was the custom of Indians long ago.)

Well, that's what my dad told me. And how come him to tell me about these, see--. We were standing out here and I was small. And he was teaching me how not to step on the grave. So that was wrong to step on a grave.

(Yes. Oh yes, I was taught that too.)

So--and these little children where they were, you know. He was telling me about it. And he said that's the way the Indians long time ago--

(In visiting just this little cemetery here, are the headstones at the east?

Look like there's something little bit different about those.)

Well, now the Indian puts -- lays 'em one way, and white man another. (That's right.)

My dad always said thát he was white man.

(Yeah.)

So that's where you're noticing the difference.

(Uh-huh. I noticed there was something there that I wasn't familiar with.)
Third voice: There may be another little mix-up there.
