They catch you, and they put you fine...but over there on the reservation is...the laws they got there all Indian laws and their own Indian governments and everything like that. No white peoples allowe to go in there....reservation. But eh...old way...wish I could be like them over nere. And we went on to Utah, and when we got over there, oh, it got cold. August, September, October we got over there. It was all really cold. And you know those people down there are really poor people. They have shacks....little shacks. Like son and his wife, daughter-in-law, and the father and mother, those sisters...just a big room...little shacks...three room house. Most ...a lot of them got tents like this. They live in tents over there. They ain't got no homes. Some of them ain't got no homes. They all live up in that reservation. And I asked these young womans, you know, I asked her, I said, "Do you all get help from the government?" and she say, "No. We don't get no help from the government." I said, "You all ought to call for help from the government. They help you if you ask"...ask us all kinds of question about how they could do get help from the government. I told them just where to write. I gave them the names and everything for Washington, you know. (?) It's been three years now...we haven't been up there. I don't know how they came out. Some of them walk fifteen miles to town...many miles. Way out there---there's a big mountain and they live at the foot of that mountain. And some of them live in the open. And they the Indians that from here...over to Utah..they the ones that left this country and went over there. And I ask them about it and they said, "Our old people that are all one told us that we came from some ranches somewhere, and it was...."
