Comanches...when they were here they come in. And they had little dogs...little dogs to lead their sled or whatever they get to...they take these old peoples and let them ride on that...what do you they call that? You seen them in pictures. The dog and their sticks you know...and made like a little cart or something back here, and you could sit on it. Little dogs could drag you. They had dogs for horses. They didn't have no borses, And when they got here, the Comanches gave them horses.

(What about the Apaches?)

The Apaches were the same way. They come in and when they come in the-Comanches made friends with them, and then they give them horses.

And these Kiowas, they didn't want them.

(Didn't want the horses?)

I mean the Apaches...they did 't want them. They drove them out. Said you all go on up north, er..south. We don't want you around here.

You don't belong in our tribe. They told them that and they keep pushing them from Denver up this way. Way back there somewhere. And they just keep coming this way. And when they come into the Comanche tribe...

(What about the Apaches. Do you know where they come from?)
That's where they come from.

(From...?)

Out west. Some of them come..but the Mescaleros come from New Mexico. We call them Mescalero Apaches.

(What about the Apaches that are here? The Kiowa-Apache?)

They come from northwest. Come in from the northwest.
