Yes, the reason you haven't seen me is that I just haven't been able to get around to all the places.

Alice: You haven't heard of any meetings, did you?

Or any meetings that's been called. However, I have contacted different ones from that area. Also, from Fairfax and Homing and every place.

In fact, they have set up a meeting at Wichita, Kansas. (Static) I won't be able to get up there until probably the 20th, and also, set a meeting for one at Independence, Kansas. I will probably, in fact, I haven't quite set that date yet. And I know the time is short, and it's almost impossible to get around to each and everyone to see them individually. However, I have talked to your mother and your sister in regards to this quite some time ago. I have tried to contact a good many people. I have contacted Mr. Silas Russell. I have talked to him and his wife just a little bit because you don't have too much time
