## TELLS REASON FOR LIVING IN TWO HOMES

I was born in 1915. November 2, 1915. Near here. It's about three and a half miles from Dustin. North, over in Okfuskee County. And I was raised just half mile from the Graham School, and we have lived in the Graham School District, until last summer, we felt like the school there was inadequate for our children and so we moved over in to Dustin just for the school
