They played hand games and had a covered dish luncheon at noon. All the women cooked and brought the food to the circle where the area was. That's what they did. Everybody had dinner together. Whoever happened to be there.

(What sort of arena was this?)

Oh, it was just a ring like you see down there at the Merces.

(Was this in Kickapoo Canyon then?)

Yes, that was in that Kickapoo Canyon and then the Merces established their dance ground in 1914.

(Where is that Merce dance ground?)

Over there east of the Y. You know where you turn down at that store and go east?

(Is that the same as the Merces dance today? Over near the Binger Y?)

Yes, Uhuh.

(Did the Caddo ever have a building in any sort of building?)

In any sort of building?

(Uh-huh.)

BARK HOUSES:

Well, I don't think so except so that they had a lodge over at the. of course I think it was used mainly for peyote afterwards, and so uh, they had, it was a great big wooden structure. Picket post style but I believe the top was, that was so far back I don't quite remember, but I think it was bark. It was a bark house
