when they hit the drum, why that's mostly all prayer songs all the way through cause that's the invocation of the then of course if there's anyhody there, it depends on who they call on for the invocation, why then after that they go on ahead and have the various dances that they want all through the night.

(You remember yoù were talking about these feathers that people had? Could you tell me something about that?)

The feather? (Thuh)

I'm afraid you'd have to ask Uncle Ralph about that because I don't know what the real, I've heard about it and I'be heard grandpa talk about it and he talked about it, but I never did pay any attention to it. But it's up to the men folks. You'd have to ask them what their titles were and so on because I sthink they have titles. To each one that were inducted into that so I wouldn't know.

(Do you know if there was one feather or if there were a lot of feathers?)

No, each one received one feather, that was all. See the Caddos don't wear a big bunch of feathers like the other Indian s do. It's just one feather that you use. There's never more than one, that's all.

(Did they do anything with them while they were dancing?)

I really couldn't say for that part for I was really too young to observe anything.

(Did the Caddo ever stop doing the Ghost Dance?)

No, we never did. It's been going on for years.

(Do women ever go and cook for the dance? Do they cook anything special?)

No, just the general, just like you would get a meal. And then everythings taken to the dance ground and served out to the people sit in a big ring,

they used to and everybody just dip up this and that and whatever you want.

They have service. They start from the east and go to the west and then whatever is left, they come back. Next to where the pole was, back of that, they have
that everybody would bring a covered dish and then that's where the ports and
coffee and everything was served. And after the prayer why then the people were
served. lThat's one thing, Caddos do not sit down at the table without a prayer.
