They used to get spanking, and anybody else, somebody else, well, they're right in it, you know. They're never out of it. (Laughter) And when a bunch of them were told to go in the dressing room and he went in there. And when the boys go in the dressing room, well, these other boys go to the door and listen. You know, they turn like that, turning a, grinding, you know, those music. They standing there making fun of him when they're in there, you know. One of the boys knew that. Says, "Mr. Farley, every time you bring us in to whip us, there'd be a bunch of boys outside." He just open that door. "Come right on in." (Laughter) He took them all in there, and gave them paddling. You know, that's the way they are. Well, we got used to it, you know, they had to do it, you know. And there's just they way. And then that's the reason some of the people, they rebell. They didn't want to send their children to school. They sent, some of them, they were finally forced to send. There was a day school there the time that the employees, you know. We had our agency there then, you know, agency at White Eagle. And the employees there used to send their children to that school. But these Indians, they, the mothers and fathers, folks, they didn't want to send their children, why were, finally, there were lot sent to the day school. Otherwise, they won't be able to speak English, I guess. (Laughter) Like, then the first thing we learned over there is this catachism. You know, we didn't know how to talk, you know, just like carrying on a conversation with one another in English. We didn't know, couldn't. But, you know,
