No, I don't know where you go to find full blood now. Different generation.

(I could--just like my boy, he's full blood. He can't hardly marry nobody that's full blood. There won't be no more after him.)

No. If there is a full blood girl someplace, he could marry her. If not in your clan. I don't know where he go unless he go to Greyhorse.

(I don't know of any full blood girls over there.)

Oh, there's some.
