Yeah, kinda like old, old Hayes Big Eagle. Old Hayes, he was a drunkard, you know. And he got in the car with me one day, I (interruption). Supposed you didn't, you knew my daddy, didn't you? Yes, yes, I did. Harry Big Eagle, well. And played ball with him. One of the finest little Indians I ever saw, little fellow. And...He said he didn't drink at all, did he?
