But the young man says, "Yes, the idea and the thought is very good." He says, "I don't have any brothers and I don't have any sisters. All I h ave is my grandmother, I don't wish to be married right now. Perhaps I can take you for a sister." He said, "You will be my sister for always and I will be the brother. And that is how the story goes about the young man who had gained a sister rather than a wife.

A story goes too just like a similar one to that one I just told you about this young man they also captured this young man at this Sun Dance at a Sun Dance, and he tried and he asked himself how will I get loose when these people had tied him and staked him out. And he was tied with wet rawhide and as the days passed this rawhide had dried. So he had a knife in his possesion which had perhaps the Gods placed there. Perhaps the God had helped him to cut himself loose. So he had cut himself free and he had climbed off this arbor. They laid him on this little platform
