I tell, you--they don't sing these old ones. They got mostly Kiowa songs. But these Arapaho songs, you know, they're kinda slow. Because they don't beat drum that fast. They just go around slow, you know.

But these Kiowas I think, makes them jump around.

(Back in the olden days, a song like that that's got kind of nasty words to it--would they ever sing that at a dance?)

Oh, yeah. They sing it.

(Do people still know these kind of songs?)

Some of them, I guess--the older ones. But I know them.

(When they used to sing these, would they be dancing with the drum and everything?)
