to get in there--not with me watching them! They're not going to get in there...

BIRDIE'S FINANCIAL SITUATION AND PLANS FOR HER HOUSE

Jordan: Birdie, if you get to stay here--if you get your water fixed--do you have any more plans for fixing this house?
