(Well, when did you put the baby in a cradle?)

Oh, I don't know about that. Some people had a baby in a cradle but I never did have a baby in a cradle.

(Well, did you just carry them around?)

Yeah, I carry them around in my arms.

(Did you have diapers then?)

Yeah, I carry around diapers wherever: I go.

(were they made out of cloth like they are now?)

Oh, they just cotton flannel on both sides. The kind they use to have. But now they got that...how do you call that...they got different diapers now. They got good diapers now.

(How did you feed your baby at first?)

Oh, I just had to....I don't feed him for about two or three days. I guess on my breast. We didn't use bottles like they use now. They put their babies on a bottle. I never did do that at least with my children.

(Well, how long did he stay on a breast?)

Oh, for a long time. About seven or eight months.

(Then what kind of food did you start feeding him?)

Soup, rice.

(Did you pay these women for helping you?)

Yeah, they're just like doctors. You pay them like doctors.

(What did you pay them, did you just give them money?)

Sometimes, I give them money, sometimes I give them ah....some kind of goods.

(Was there any specific amount of how much you had to give them?)

No, I paid them the same amount. Maybe I give them five dollars, then I give each five dollars.

(They did this for a living?)
