GHOST DANCE SONG AND MORE ON ARAPAHO GHOST DANCE

(Open with Myrtle singing. She sings five or six Ghost Dance songs. The last one is a Quitting Song.)

That's a Quitting Song (referring to the last song sung). And it says, "This is what our Father says to you all: Stop five times." See, they always stop over here, and here, and here, and over here, and over here. (Five times in the circle).

(What do you mean by stopping that way?)

Well, they used to stop and just dance like this, you know. And then stop. And when they say "hii.yoñae..." Then they used to start again.

(Let's see. They'd be dancing around in a big circle.)

Yeah. And they'd go out and when it says "stop", they used to stop, you know, that way. But they used to still go by this--still go up and down (dance in place).

(Now when they were going up and down, was this the kind of a step where they bend their kneew, or would they just be--?)

Yeah, they just stand there, and go like this. And then when they say "start," they used to start again. They used to stop five times.

(Was that just on the Quitting Song that they did that?)

Yeah, the Quitting Song. That's all. That's when they do that.

(Was there an Opening Song, too?)

I don't know. They used to just start on any of them songs. I don't think they--well, I think that first song I sing of this Round Dance, it sure sound
