(O.K. And if Imogene had a daughter and we were talking about her daughter, what would you say?)

hitω.nω

(And if there's several women and you're talking about all of their daughters--how would you refer to them?)

hitω.naehinω -- "their daughters."

(And if you were talking to a group of women, and you were saying "your daughters"?)

hωtω.naehinω -- same thing. hωtω.naehinω "your daughters."

(Would it make any difference if I said hitω.naehinω or hωtω.naehinω ?)
