Sarah Long Horn was born August 15, 1902. Sarah was born in Kiowa County and grew up around Long Horn Mountain and spring. She comes from a family of three sisters and one brother. She attended Rainy Mountain Boarding School through the sixth grade, but due to illness she had to quit school when she was twelve years of age. The name Long Horn in Kiowa Indian language is Goo en tine. Sarah's mother was named Pahahty. She chose her maiden name, therefore, her father's English name was Long Horn. Sarah's father was half Comanche and Kiowa and her mother was Kiowa.
