

Yeah, that would be n'É sih'ú. but if I say "my uncle,"

n'É si

(n'É si?)

Yeah. If someone said "Who is that man standing over there,"

I'd say "n'É si" And if I'd call him, I'd say "n'É sih'ú."

(I see. Now, would n'É si be your mother's brother?)

Yeah.

(What would be your father's brother?)

né.s'ún'w.

(What about the husbands and wives of these people--like your

mother's sister's husband. What would you call him?)

I'd call him n'Éx'ú

(Same as your father?)

Yeah, the same. I'd say né.s'ún'w -- n'Éx'ú. is when you call him.

(What about the husband of your aunt--the one you call n'É heí --her husband?)

n'É si -- the same, like "uncle".

(Or if you're talking right to him you could say n'É sih'ú. ?)

Yeah, n'É sih'ú.

(What about your grandparents, now, like your mother's mother.

What would you call her?)

nei.baehae

(Would you say that again?)

nei.baehae

(What if you're talking about her to someone else?)

I would say nei.baehae But if I call her, I'd say new'ú.
