and all that. It wasn't like that.

(Could she stay in the tipi or tent with other people or did she ever have to--?)

It's different tribe maybe. Different tribe, they used to put them way out in the fields, I heard. But these, they didn't do that. They stayed right in with the rest. But they used to say that some kind of tribe, when girls had their period, they used to go and make little place for them to stay. That's what I heard. But no, these didn't do that.

(Would a girl be embarrassed to talk about it maybe to her sisters, or even before her brothers-in-law or anything like that?)

No, they won't talk about it. Things like that, they won't bring them out.

PREGNANCY

(That makes me think--what if a young girl, if she did get pregnant, maybe by her brother-in-law, or maybe somebody else--who would she go to, to tell about it or talk to about it. Who would be the person that she might tell?)

They would have to see it. It had to come out by itself, and then when they ask her then she would tell who it is. That's the way.

(She wouldn't tell them before it showed?)

No, she wouldn't tell them.

(If this ever happened where a young girl got pregnant and she wasn't married, would she maybe ever try to do anything where she wouldn't have the baby? Make a miscarriage come or something?)

No. They don't believe in that. But this new generation, they go to a doctor and they get pills and lose their babies that way. That's what I heard. I find a pill one time on the street.
