BACKGROUND OF INFORMANT:

Mamie Turkey Long is 70 years old. She has lived in the area of Turkey Ford Community all of her life. Mamie has grown the tobacco for her tribe's ceremonials since she was ten years old. She is one of the "Pot Hangers," which means that she has been appointed as one of the cooks for special occasions, such as ceremonials, etc. She attended Seneca Indian school at Wyandotte, Oklahoma.
