BRIEF INTRODUCTION BORN IN 1902 - ATTENDED SEVERAL BOARDING SCHOOLS YOUNG INDIANS ARE NOT INTERESTED IN FARMING MORE ABOUT SCHOOL DAYS CHANGING TIMES HAVE BROUGHT PROBLEMS TO INDIANS NO STORIES AMONG THE CADDO PEOPLE HAS BEEN TRIBAL SECRETARY SINCE 1941 TRIBAL DANCING IS ABOUT OVER - YOUNG PEOPLE ARE NOT INTERESTED NAMES OF SEVERAL DANCES IN EARLIER YEARS MISSIONARIES NEED FOR INDIAN AGENCY NOT READY FOR TERMINATION GOOD WORKERS BUT NOT GOOD BUSINESS MANAGERS - LACK TRAINING INTERMARRIAGE TEXAS-ARKANSAS-LOUISIANS LAND CLAIMS STILL PENDING - WERE FILED SIXTEEN YEARS AGO

BACKGROUND OF INFORMANT:

Andrew Dunlap was born July 9, 1902, north of Gracemont, Oklahoma. In 1911 he went to school at Riverside Indian School in Anadarko and St. Patrick's Mission in 1912 and back in Riverside until 1917 at which time he went to Chilocco. Mr. Dunlap has been active in the affairs of the Caddo Tribe, having served as Secretary since 1941.
