(Would they ever tease?)

No.

(Nephew is néél'éoè, isn't it?)

Yeah.

(Would an aunt ever make things for her nephew or try to do things for him?)

Oh, yeah, they make moccasins for them or maybe a shirt--something like that.

(Would an awnt make anything for her niece, too?)

Yeah, they always make things for them.

(What kind of things would she make for a niece?)

Maybe a dress. Moccasins. Maybe a necklace.

(Would a mother make things for her boys, too?)

Yeah. They make things. Anything they can make for their children-both girls and boys.

(What about grandparents--do they make things for their grand-kids?)

Yeah. They make things for their grandchildren. Just in clothing --like dresses and moccasins. Maybe necktie, or something like that.

(What about a woman--how would she treat her husband's brother? How do they get along with each other?)

Oh, they don't have any trouble. They don't have no troubles. They all get along. They get along. They don't have any hard feelings against their brother-in-laws or sister-in-laws.

(Could a woman tease her husband's brother like she does her sister's wife?)

Yeah, they tease one another.

(Would it be the same kind of teasing like with her sister's husband?)

Yeah.

'(Would they ever grab each other, and so forth?)

Yeah. I thought I told you all that before. I remember I told you some things like that. They always throw water on them. (End of tape.)
