read about them and I've heard that they still have them.)

I don't know. In my days, they used to tell womans didn't supposed to talk about them. That was their religion. You ask a man. You ask that Everett or either Archie, ask them about--

(Then I heard about the Arapaho; they have a pipe of some kind.)

I don't know what they had. They have some kind of religion too, but

I don't know. All the Indians used to have them kind of religion—used

to keep something but I don't know. It's all getting—dying off or passed

away. But when we gone—my age—old man and myself—but they still dance,

I don't think they never forget that dance.

(How old is the Native American Church?)

The Native American Church--I don't know. Mens use that Native American Church. That  $A_r$ chie use it and Everett. That old man, Phi'l Whitebear is the one you can ask about the Native American Church.

(You said that Archie Walker and Everett were--)

Medicine men. Not in Native American Church, they do't belong. Everett and that Frank Pendleton.

(Do woman go to the peyote church?)

eah. Womans. But I try to be a Christian woman, you know.

(Did they have the Native American Church when you were a girl?)

Yeah, as far as I can remember.

(What did the Christians think about that?)

Oh, the white missionaries, preachers, they against it. But can't do nothing. They always try, but they can't do it.

(Did they have missionaries a long time ago that would work among the Cheyenne and Arapaho?)
