

They dress, they wear black shawls. They dance over here one time.

(Are they Cheyenne?)

No, they are Apaches. We call them Blackfeet Society. But these gourd clan, they just wear shawls--shwals and gourds..Some of them wore moccasins some of them just wear shoes--and got a fan in one hand. My old man dances but them others they dress up. Blackfeet society, maybe they're the ones you've seen over there. I think they were the ones that put up that pow-wow. It was announced on the radio--Saturday morning at 11:35. It come on Indian hour they call it, from Norman--tells where they're going to have pow-wows and benefit dances and anything going. I heard they said they was going to have a pow-wow Blackfeet Society, somewhere in Ft. Cobb.

(Are the Cheyenne going to have a pow-wow?)

Yeah, at Clinton and another bunch they're going to have it over here at Watonga. They used to but they don't anymore. But they dance once in a while when a soldier boy comes home. They have a benefit dance for him at City Hall. The hospital across from that, they dance.

(Have they been having benefit dances for soldiers for a long time?)

Soldiers or whenever they collect money, something like pow-wow -- benefit dance they call it--they always dance.

DANCES: DIFFERENT WAR DANCE IN OLD DAYS, SUN DANCE:

(What kind of dances did they have when you were young?)

Same kind--war dances and round dances. In round dance woman must wear shwals you know. But the war dancers didn't use to dance the way they dance now. They sure danced fast now. They got feathers all over them these young boys--long time they used to dress different.
