

(How did they dress?)

They wear beaded vests. They used to have headdress they call it (indicates roach type headdress) black cloth leggings with bead work on it. They used to have beels, mocasins, and shirts. They didn't use to dance fast. Maybe you've seen them the way they dance, they just dance fast. They dance fast or faster.

(Did they dance a different step a long time ago?)

Same step but slow. Some of them started--they call it slow war dancers. They dress like the old times--Pawnee and--but these boys wear feathers all over just like birds--sure dance fast too. Long time before my day they used to Ghost Dance. I forget how they dance the Ghost Dance. They used to talk about it--Cheyennes, Arapaho and the Sioux I think.

(Have they had the Sun Dance for a long time?)

Yeah, our boy just told us lately that he has to go to the Sun Dance he said. You might come along if they're really going to have it--at Sealing--Canton the other side. I don't know how many miles but that's where they always have it. They have it in July. There was a preacher there one time. He take pictures of it. He was writing a Cheyenne history too--an Episcople preacher. We called him Father Pow from Chicago the one you can see at Sealing if you go there. They own that land where they always have it. His name San Buffalo.

(What is the meaning of the Sun Dance?)

I don't know what the meaning of it. It's been going on for a long time. I don't know--ever since my grandma days, my great grandma days.

(What do they do in the Sun Dance?)

Well, you'll see them, they just dance.
