And then the owner had the house. We used to all camp along the creek.

(The owner was Salome?)

Yeah.

(Was this Mrs. Bull Tongue Arapaho?)

Yeah, they were all Arapahoes.

(When you all were camped down there, would you all speak Arapaho or--?)

Yeah, they used to all speak Arapaho.

(Were your tents pretty close to each other?)
