

came home, I had never told them. At the church she said Virginia that was Nannies mothers name call me to one side and told me the whole story and we all approved of it. There we live as man and wife in Indian fashion and we drove to Lawton and I had just enough money to buy our license and there we were legally married by Judge Armstrong and a constable as witnesses I told the Judge I did not have any money to pay him but he said its legal, its ok with him some day, if you feel like it you can pay me, Which I did soon afterwards. I had plenty horses but no carriage to carry my wife while in Lawton I went to then Benbow Horton Hardware Co. and talk to George Horton, himself. Who is yet living today, 1962 on Cache Road about 5 miles west now living on Horton Dairy Farm. The Indians at that time draws money from Government every 6 months also rentals from allotments and mostly business was all on credit. He sold me a heavy pretty mountain buggy, and harness.
