

right there in public and everybody saw it. So he made a scene of it, I guess, of Jim Takone. It was during a camp meeting--a church camp meeting. That's how I know about it. It was at Redstone Church (several miles west of Anadarko, north of Apache Y). There's a building standing there yet. Now this Takone is a brother to Myrtle--Myrtle Ware. Myrtle and Takone are brother and sister. That Takone, he's the father of Winston Cat's wife. Winston Cat's wife's father was Takone.

(Which one of the Wares did Myrtle marry?)

Lewis. Lewis Ware.

(Who is this Peadah?)

He's feeble-minded. He was raised by Big Tree. They might have been kin to that family, I don't know. But they raised him to manhood. Big Tree did. Later on moved to another family--Waterman's home. They call him to' k'ae.hi They had raised and was keeping Pea-dah's sister, gomodl was her name. Or pu'hw. --that's her Agency name. Well, she finally died and is buried in that cemetery by the highway, going downhill to the Ware's Chapel Church--first grave at the entrance--you see a little monument. That's her stone--gomodl's. I buried her. I used to be in charge of the mission work there at the Ware's Chapel, in the early days. And she died over there and I buried her. She's the first one that was buried in that cemetery. We laid off the cemetery. They didn't have any cemetery in that community so I bought that land and laid that cemetery for her. She was the first one to be buried there. That's Pea-dah's sister.

ANECDOTE ABOUT PEA-DAH IN SCHOOL

(Was Pea-dah Kiowa?)

Yes. But he had a very childish mind. I tell you what happened when Big Tree sent him to school. I don't believe I told you about this. This woman was also feeble-minded, just like Pea-dah. Pea-dah was a little boy about 8 or 9
