Verden, Oklahoma--Chickasha. In the early days Mr. Jones was a United States

marshal. He was Nellie Jones' husband--the oldest daughter of that ^{sae.kʷdlmá}

(And Nellie is the daughter of ^{sae.kʷdlmá} ?)

Yes.

(And her husband is Jimmy Jones?)

Yes, that's right.

(Now this Nellie--did you call her "sister"?)

I do, yeah. It's just a step-sister, but in the Indian way we just call her

"sister" like she was a full sister. I call her sister. All them girls--

Annie, and Nellie.

(How do you say "sister" in Kiowa?)

dʷ. or dʷ.té. , you say that, "sister." But for short they just say
dʷ.

(O.K. Did Nellie have another sister?)

Yes. Maggie Smokey. She's dead now, too. Enoch Smokey's wife.

(Were there any other children of ^{sae.kʷdlmá} ?)

No, just those three girls is all. Three girls and one boy, Willie Burton.

(Did he go by the last name of Burton?)

No, his last name is Aionty. But he had two English names. Middle name and

all. They just used the whole name together. Well, his boys are living. They

just call themselves Burton. They don't use "Willie". They just call themselves
