(Would you say that once more?)

(What does that mean?)

I think it's "Crooked Spine Woman." She was the daughter of Chief Zeba-Edal (zeba[^]edal). Zeba-Edal was brother to Kicking Bird in 1871 when the Indians come in. That's the original Kicking Bird. There was another one named Kick Bird. Zeba-Edal was one of the first Kiowas to become a prince by a ceremony. There's a big long story about that prince ceremony. They don't
