That was about all a person, a young..they didn't know how to work..they couldn't do nothing when they was a young girl. They just had to be..set there and behave yourself and mind the parents. I never had that chance were a boy would come courting at night. They used to wear sheets and blankets to come courting to these Indian girls..young women.

(Would they just come up to the..)

Tent..to the tent. They'd stand around and they talk with you. Then they'd leave and be social with the other one.

CHILDHOOD: GAMES, PARENTAL ADVICE:

(What kind of games did you like to play when you were little?)

We never had very many games like they do. In my days we just had little rags to make our dolls. Cigar box, made little wagons of them.

We made little Indian dolls and we made little wagons out of cigar boxes and we put our little dolls in and drag them around. Make and hole and make a string on one end of that cigar box and drag them around.

(Did you play any other kinds of games when a bunch of little girls would play together?)

We all played at what we call doll playing or doll rags we call them, because we didn't know very much English..tried to call little doll clothes
