That's a boy talking to a girl. He wanted to know why she hate him. She loved him last summer.

(Another song, Number 16, played. A Love Song, or Forty-Nine. Cheyenne words.)

(What kind of a song was that?)

That's a Love Song. Now this girl, she said, "My friend, I love my boy friend. I love him. I'm going to marry him." That's what it said. She's talking to her girl friend. "My friend, I really love my boy friend--" That's was it says in the first of it. "I'm going to marry him."

(Could you say the Cheyenne words real slow?)

· (Myrtle repeats Cheyenne words slowly.)

(You said it's a love song--could you also call it a Forty-Nine, too?)

Yeah, yeah. Something like that. They always dance that way. (Have you known that one a long time?)
Yeah.
