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Now, what do you mean by responsibility? The Bureau has supervision over these lands. To what extent does that supervision run.

is what I am really asking. What is the source of your authority over those lands, you see? How do you come to the policy that says that you have supervisory authority over those lands?

Part of those lands, the ones that were A acquired by the United States of America, were transferred from the Department of Agriculture to the Department of Interior by secretarial order for, I believe it says, administration. (The other lands are restricted -- they are just tribal lands that are under the jurisdiction of the Bureau and I don't know any specific statute that places them under the jurisdiction of the Bureau.

Back to Section 32, Mr. Daugherty, the 30 acres that your records do not reflect in Section 32 are or are not in the southwest quarter of Section 32?
