

CROSS EXAMINATION

BY MR. O'BRYAN:

Q Mr. Daugherty, as I understand your testimony at the present time you are trying to tell us that the federal government has some interest in the land where this particular act may or may not have taken place, is that not correct?

A Yes, the land in Section 32.

Q Now, if this particular act took place in Section 32, referring directly to it, was this land ever a part of the State of Oklahoma?

A I don't have the entire title history of the property. Now, I know that some of these tracts belong to individuals and were acquired from individuals, but I don't know the history of the tracts from allotment until the time they were acquired by the government.

Q Well, is it possible, then, that some of those lands in Section 32 out there could have been lands that belonged to the State of Oklahoma and were simply purchased --

MR. KAMINS: Your Honor, we will object to that because Mr. Daugherty answered he doesn't have any chain of title.

THE COURT: Well, he can answer too. There have been more or less a lot of leading
