3 Go ahead.

4 Q (by Mr. O'Bryan) All right. Is it
5 possible, then, that some of that land belonged to the
6 State of Oklahoma out there and that the federal government
7 simply purchased the land in trust for the welfare of
8 Indians?

9 Now, by Indians, I mean all Indians in the area.

10 A You mean directly from state ownership?

11 Q Directly from state ownership or from
12 individuals who were simply -- had proprietary interest
13 in the land.

14 A Yes, it is possible.

15 Q Do you know if the State of Oklahoma has
16 ever seated its rights over any of that land?

17 A I don't know.

18 Q You used the word "Kenwood Indian Reserve,"
19 a minute ago. Was this reservation land at anytime?
20 I'm confused about the word "reserve," as opposed to the
21 word "reservation."

22 A Our records officially call this a project,
23 not a reserve or not a reservation. Now --

24 Q To your knowledge was any of this property
25 ever reserved property, now?
