the -- shortly after the formation of this country, that were ratified -- treaties that were entered into between the Cherokees and Britain, and we traced the series of treaties down through the removal treaty, and there are mentioned in those ratifications by the congress of those series of treaties. The inference of hunting-rights, and one of the inducements to the Cherokees being brought here, and we brought out testimony, was the great amount of game in northeastern Oklahoma, and there was a very strong presumption that the --

THE COURT:

There was everything

except a clause granting them the right for hunting and fishing, wasn't there? Every inference, you might want to say.

But, 1'm saying: where is the conflict, with the treaty? Apparently you are bringing it on the basis there is a conflict with the treaty with the Cherokee tribe. I can find none.

MR. KAMINS:

Your Honor, there

is no specific mention of hunting and fishing because of the fact that these treaties ran prior to this nation. The only reason we have specific hunting and fishing treaties in the northwest is the fact that those tribes were moved into that area at the time that some of the states were being brought into the republic, and therefore,
