(What about the Caddo Indians?)

t'w ní.bæ'oi' That means "Big nostrils."

(What about the Wichita Indians?)

I wouldn't know.

(One name you gave me quite a while ago means something like "Lot of Timber Men". That's--what tribe is Bessie? (Pause) Creek. Creek Indians.

h'w w'w h'w . a'eti.nɛ n That's Creek Indians--"Timber Men."

(What about the Potawatomis?)

n'w x'w'w hi'oi' --that means "Watermelon."

(Why would they call them that?)

I don't know why they call them "watermelon" but that's Potawatomi. Joe Neely's tribe. n'w w'w x'w'w h'w'w --that's one man.

(What about the Kiowa-Apaches--do you have a name for them?)

Kiowa-Apaches?

(You remember that Big Ben Chaletsin--what tribe he was?)

You know I don't know. Really, I don't know.

(What about the Tonkawa Indians?)

Well, all I know is Tonkawa. You know they used to have tomahawks. And they're named after that tomahawks-- hi'ca'e' a'x'uun'ɛ n

(What about the Mexicans?)

'c'w'w'w .ní.nɛ n That means "Bread Men." "Bread" and a "Man."
