That means "Fall off a horse."

(Were there any other district names?)

Hammond, they used to call it Red Moon, in Indian.

(How would you say that in Arapaho?)

hisisbae ei (Or hisi.sbaehhi ) That's "Red Moon."

(Did they have a different name for Eagle City--?)

ni ω hein ω ω wu' That means "Eagle Town "

(What about Carleton--was there an Arapaho name for that?)

(What does that mean?)

"No Shoes". "Barefoot."

(Are there any other?)

Longdale-- that means "Long Body." -- haey  $\omega$  cehi And Seiling, in Indian, they always say,  $t\omega b\hat{\omega}$  .náet

(What does that mean?)

"One Leg."

(Like if you had one leg amputated?)

Yeah. That Amos Chapman. He was married among the Cheyennes and they cut his leg off, and they call it  $t\omega b\omega$  .naet because he was there.
